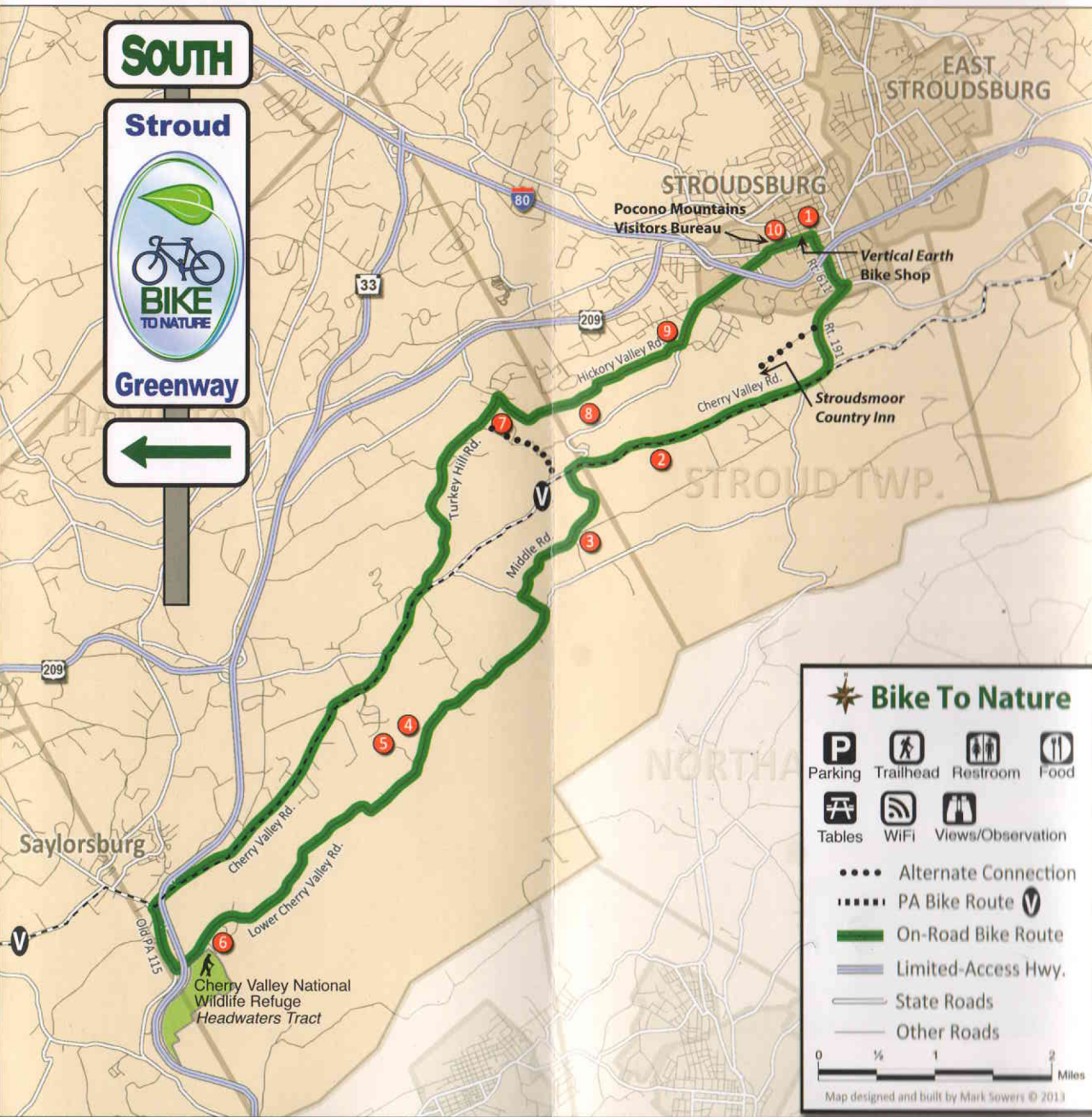


Bike To Nature

2 Josie Porter Farm



Pedal to this community supported farm and stop in at the farm store (open seasonally) to learn more about the farm's CSA program and Buyers Club. The farm honors the legacy of the late Josephine Porter and her contributions to biodynamic farming. Events and programs are hosted throughout the year to connect people to the earth and to help foster a sustainable food system.

3 Blakeslee Farm



Capture a glimpse of one of the many bird species, especially waterfowl and grassland species such as wrens, meadowlarks and bobolinks. This farm is owned by The Nature Conservancy, an international conservation organization, and leased to members of the Blakeslee family. Open to the public for guided tours only.

4 Cherry Valley Trout Hatchery



See Brook Trout, Rainbow, Brown and Palomino trout raised in earthen tanks at Cherry Valley Trout Hatchery. The hatchery was established in 1979. It provides stocked trout for some local fishing clubs in local streams and may also stock streams outside the region as far as Connecticut. Open seven days a week from 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM.

5 Pocono Wildlife Rehabilitation Center



Arrange a visit (appointment required & donation requested) at this exceptional and important place where injured and orphaned wild animals are cared for until they can fend for themselves, before they are released back to the wild. The Center offers live wildlife educational programs using animals not releasable to the wild. Events and programs are held throughout the year.

6 Sorrenti's Cherry Valley Vineyard



The perfect place to "drink in" the Pocono Mountains and try some of Pennsylvania's best wines. Take a guided tour of the winery. Enjoy the beautiful outdoor landscape, which rests at the base of the Appalachian Mountains and is adjacent to the trail head for the "Headwaters Tract" of the National Wildlife Refuge.

7 Quiet Valley Historical Farm



This 19th century Pennsylvania German farm dedicated to the preservation and education of rural farm life is open to the public for tours during the summer and early fall. Guides portray family members of the Johann Zepper descendants through story and hands on demonstrations. Special events, workshops and educational programs occur throughout the year, including summer day camps.

8 Hickory Valley Park



Relax and enjoy the outdoors at this 100-acre municipal park along the pristine McMichael Creek. Hiking, fishing, cross-country skiing and other passive recreational opportunities can be enjoyed and a large mowed field is great for throwing a Frisbee or football, kicking a soccer ball, or other field activities.

9 Glen Brook Golf Club



Enjoy outdoor/indoor dining at the Clubhouse of the Glen Brook Golf Club. This stone farmhouse was built in the 1790's by Colonel Jacob Stroud, founder of Stroudsburg, for his oldest son, John who preferred "the life of a farmer" and moved from the Main Street residence to this farmhouse one mile west of Stroudsburg.

10 Stroud Mansion



Visit the headquarters of the Monroe County Historical Association and explore the local history museum and library. This historic 1795 Stroud Mansion is the finest example of Georgian-style architecture in Monroe County. The 12-room house, an imposing structure for its time, was built by Jacob Stroud, founder of Stroudsburg and a Revolutionary War colonel, as a home for his son, Daniel.
